## **INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE – ANNUAL REPORT 2022**

We are proud to present here a preview of the IFHE Annual Report. Enjoy the introductory message and don't miss the full report which can be downloaded at ifhe.org.

It is a hallmark of our profession that we address research and education on sustainable resource management at the household and consumer level from an interdisciplinary perspective. We finally experienced and demonstrated this particular approach again at the World Congress, our long awaited flagship event, which took place in Atlanta in 2022 after it had to be rescheduled due to the pandemic. Despite international travel being nowhere near its former levels, participants from 35 countries arrived and made the congress the forum for international exchange in our discipline that we all had hoped and waited for. Since, for the first time, online participation was also an option and turned out the be a great success, this type of hybrid (sustainable) platform will certainly be offered in the future.

A special thematic focus for 2022 was the every–day importance of food and nutrition education. The IFHE's appeal to the United Nations to establish nutrition education as a central element in the recovery from COVID–19 is worth highlighting here. IFHE also became a partner in an international food literacy research consortium. Here, opportunities to learn about food are created, developing people's capacity to act in ways that support sustainable consumption and equitable access to food.

As always, the international reach of our work was only possible because of the national and regional associations, our member institutions and the many members who volunteer their time in research, education, or consulting. A big thank you also goes to the IFHE General Secretariat, which, led by the IFHE Executive Director Annette Ptassek, has tirelessly and prudently modernized the Federation since 2018.
