Resolution

Restoration or Conservation of the intellectual, moral, social and economic Inheritance of Countries by Women's Education

1. Relating to Domestic Subjects in General

The Congress notes with satisfaction, that in all countries adherent to the International Federation of Domestic Science, great efforts have been accomplished to give young girls both adequate technical instruction in Domestic Subjects and a sense of their high social responsibilities...

The Congress believes that the difficult days in which we live afford excellent opportunities for educating youth: all those concerned with their education are forced to consider carefully what they have to teach, if they are to develop the powers which are vitally necessary to the rising generations.

2. Relating the Restoration or the Conservation of the intellectual, moral, social and economic inheritance

This Congress considers that the problem of the restoration and the conservation of our intellectual, moral, social and economic inheritance is a matter of fundamental importance to all nations and of civilization, depends on our finding an adequate solution.

Civilisation depends on the different, but equally important contributions of both man and woman. It follows therefore that we must not omit anything which can help the girl to grow into a woman who will contribute as fully as possible to the social well-being.

3. The use of films, broadcasting, available for instruction in domestic science

The Congress believes that films, broadcasting afford a valuable aid in the instruction of domestic science, if applied as the surrounding requires. Their use is recommended as much as possible to help teachers in their education and practical tasks.
