

#### Weather

Galway has a year-round mild, moist, temperate and changeable climate. The city does not experience temperature extremes and receives an average of 1,156 mm (45.51 in) of rain annually, which is evenly distributed throughout the year. The average January temperature in the city is 5.9 °C (43 °F) and the average July temperature is 15.9 °C (61 °F). While extreme weather is rare, the city and county can experience severe windstorms. Most of these storms occur between late autumn and early spring. Due to the city's northerly location, Galway has long summer days. Sunrise on summer solstice occurs at 05:07 and sunset at 22:07. By contrast, on winter solstice, the sun rises at 08:49 and sets at 16:19.

#### **Currency: Euro €**

Coin: There are eight different coin denominations: €2, €1, 50c, 20c, 10c, 5c, 2c and 1c

Paper: There are seven different denominations of euro banknotes: €5, €10, €20, €50, €100, €200 and €500
